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Safe2Tell Wyoming Presents Award to High School Student

Rock Springs, Wyo: On May 15, 2019, Safe2Tell Wyoming will recognize a Black Butte High School student for creating a Safe2Tell Poster. Safe2Tell Wyoming challenged Wyoming students to create posters that covered issues such as bullying, mental health, and social media responsibility.

Lilian Hall, a senior from Black Butte High School won the Safe2Tell Wyoming Poster Contest for the high school level. Hall will receive a \$100 prize along with her teacher, Shari Kumer. Hall created a poster about students being careful on what they post online. Their digital footprint might come back to “haunt” them. "It is encouraging to see students showing a vested interest in this program and recognizing its importance by getting the word out in their school and community," said Samantha Kanish, Public Relations Specialist for Safe2Tell Wyoming.
